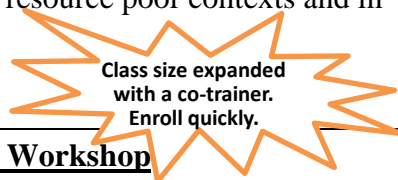

Dr. Ruud Jongedijk is a psychiatrist and psychotherapist. He is also the clinical director of Foundation Centrum '45 in the Netherlands, a national specialised centre for diagnostics and treatment of patients with complex trauma complaints. Since 2007, he developed and implemented NET in the Netherlands, in collaboration with Vivo International (Germany). Dr. Gerdie EITING is affiliated with the Arq Psychotrauma Expert Group and works as a medical doctor and experienced psycho-trauma therapist at Foundation Centrum '45. For the past 10 years she has been conducting trauma therapies including Narrative Exposure Therapy (NET), Brief Eclectic Psychotherapy for PTSD (BEPP) and Eye Movement Desensitisation Reprocessing (EMDR) therapy. Together with Ruud Jongedijk she developed the Dutch NET Course, and since 2011 she has been providing national and international NET workshops.

Narrative Exposure Therapy (NET) is an evidence-based approach for the treatment of trauma-related mental disorders, especially PTSD. Given its focus on the autobiographical elaboration of traumatic experiences, NET is particularly suitable for populations affected by multiple traumatic experiences like sexual, familial or organized violence. NET is a time limited therapy, varying from 4 to 12 sessions. The most essential elements of NET are the creation of the lifeline of the patient and then working through this lifeline by doing exposure therapy in a chronologic order. The therapeutic process takes into consideration the context of a traumatic event and the life history of the person as a whole. Usually, a rope (lifeline) with flowers (happy events), stones (traumatic events), sometimes candles (grief) and sticks (aggressive acts) are used to assist the narrative process. To date, there is good evidence that NET is an effective treatment approach with support from 20 RCT's (N=1048) with proven efficacy both in resource poor contexts and in Western clinical settings.
