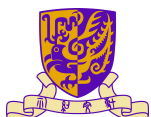


Richard Bryant, PhD is an Australian Research Council Laureate Fellow, Scientia Professor in the School of Psychology, University of New South Wales, and is Director of the Traumatic Stress Unit, Westmead Hospital, Australia. His research has focused on psychological responses to trauma and bereavement. He has identified some of the key biological and cognitive markers of risk for trauma and loss, and conducted major early interventions trials for both conditions. He has published 350 journal articles, 50 book chapters, and authored 3 books. He has served on the Traumatic Stress Work Groups for both DSM-5 and ICD-11, where he has led initiatives on prolonged grief disorder. He serves as a consultant to many international civilian and government agencies on managing disaster and loss.
