Relief work on foreign soil How to make psychosocial support in a different culture effective

In recent decades, disaster relief work has recognized the importance of psychosocial support for the affected. Guidelines and manuals on psychological first aid and recovery skills emphasizing the 'do-no-harm' and 'evidence-informed' approach have been adopted in disaster relief work and training of relief worker. This approach is different from providing psychological treatment, which is not advised, especially when the relief worker is from a different culture, speaks a different language and will only stay with the community affected for a limited time.

The speakers of this seminar, who have hands-on experience of working in disaster abroad, will share their experience and observation of the needs and cautions related to provision of disaster psychosocial support work abroad.
